TEDDY'S HOSPITAL MAZE


Help Teddy get through his overnight stay at the hospital so he isn't scared. Find the number that goes with the picture on the next page.

- 3. The Child Life Specialist shows him the mask that will help Teddy fall asleep for his surgery. She lets him know he will also get medicine through his special straw, or IV, that he received in the Emergency Department too.
- 4. Teddy gets a visit from the volunteer and builds a huge lego tower while he waits in his room!
- 5. It's surgery time! Teddy is excited and scared at the same time! He remembers the Child Life Specialist in the Emergency Department told him, "Teddy, if you get scared, take deep breaths like you're blowing out all the candles on your cake and can't get that last one!" This will help you calm your body. Teddy closes his eyes and pretends he's blowing all the candles out on his birthday cake.
- 6. Teddy is back in his room and he feels kind of dizzy. His nurse says that's normal after surgery. The Child Life Assistant brings his favorite movie, Frozen, to watch as he recovers in his room.
- 7. His other nurse brings his favorite snack Orange Jello!
- 8. Teddy participates in a fun event from the monthly activities calendar before the doctor gives him the okay to go home.
- 9. Teddy will always remember his hospital stay and how everyone helped him so he wasn't scared!






You will hear many new words while you are at the hospital. Some of them may sound confusing.

Does CAT Scan mean it will have cats in it?

Why is he calling the bed a stretcher?

What does it mean when she says I need to "void" in a cup?



Below are some words that are used in the hospital. When you hear a new word, write it down and ask your doctor, nurse or child life specialist what they mean.

IV: Soft, flexible tube called a catheter that is used to put medicine or special water into your veins.

Anesthesia: Medicine that will either make you feel sleepy or put you in a sleep like state (different than the sleep at night when you go to bed) for surgery or a procedure.

Dressing: A special clean bandage used to cover a part of your body while it heals.

Chest Tube: A small tube put into your chest, near the lung to take out liquid and help you breathe.

Fracture: A broken bone

NPO: Nothing to eat or drink


Syringe: A clean plastic tube that holds medicine or fluid.

Even if it doesn't always feel like it, your fears are just a small part of you. You are SO much bigger than your fears.





PICTURE TIME!

The doctor needs to know about the inside of your body. One way they can find out more is with an x-ray. Other ways to view the inside of your body are with a CT, MRI or ultrasound. These different machines take pictures of your body, like a camera taking a picture. The doctor may have you sitting, standing, or lying down while taking these pictures. These cameras also do not touch your body. You may put on a gown and it might be cold in the room, so you can ask for a blanket.



An X-ray provides a picture of inside the body by using special radioactive rays. An X-ray can show bones, tissues or parts of organs.

You may need to take different kinds of medicine while you are at the hospital. It is never because you are bad or did something wrong. Medicine is given in many different ways.



Medicine in a cup








Medicine through an IV





Here is a picture of the Operating Room or Surgery Room. It has special equipment and lights. Some children will breath sleepy medicine (anesthesia) for their operation.


Some children will have medicine through their IV. If you are getting a mask with sleepy medicine ask if you can choose a special flavor or scent!


